As we enter the holy month of Ramadan, we wish you and your families a peaceful and blessed time.



the winners!



This hands-on activity encouraged them to think creatively and scientifically, applying their knowledge of materials and structure to build functional, imaginative designs.



We are so proud of their hard work and creativity. Keep shining, Year 1! 🌟


















KS3
